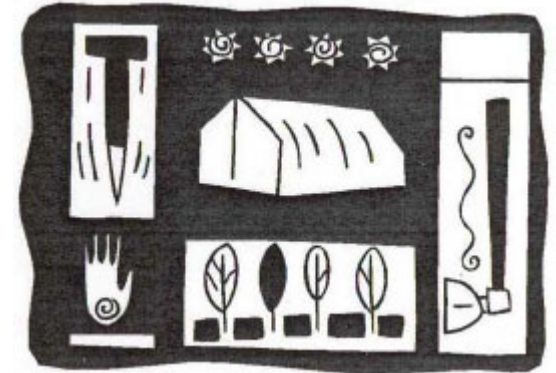

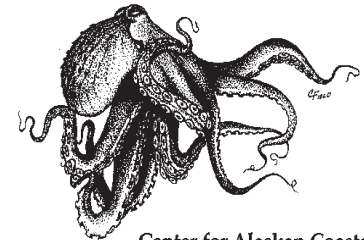

Wynn Center Highlights

The Wynn Nature Center is located at 1.5 miles East Skyline Drive on the bluff overlooking Homer. The Wynn Center is 140 acres of spruce forests, wildflower meadows, and wetlands and is the perfect habitat for exploring. Junior Naturalists will learn about what unique components make up a forest, observe moose, identify edible and medicinal plants, and have lots of fun.

What is a Junior Naturalist?

A Junior Naturalist is a young person with a curiosity about the natural world. A Junior Naturalist is also someone who wants to explore hidden trails, track animals, smell wildflowers, dig through octopus middens, and watch sea stars digest clams. If this sounds like you, then join us as we spend four days discovering the unique habitats at the Wynn Nature Center and the Peterson Bay Field Station.

Peterson Bay Highlights

The semi-remote Peterson Bay Field Station is located on the south shore of Kachemak Bay and is a short boat ride from Homer. This area has excellent access to the rich intertidal areas of Peterson and China Poot Bays. Junior Naturalists will observe marine creatures, conduct plankton tows, peer through microscopes, hike through the coastal forest and much more.
